

## **New York Microscopical Society, 2008 Spring Lecture Series**

"Problem Solving with Photon Microscopy and Microchemistry"

Arthur Coates, Microtherm Technologies

May 2008

Wednesday, May 28th, 2008, 7:30 pm American Museum of Natural History, Linder Theater, New York, NY

This talk will focus on microchemical tests
Arthur Coates has used as a consultant to
resolve various client problems. Solving a
production or process problem requires a
logical sequence of deductions back to the
source. Very few problems require
complicated solutions, but they do require a
wide and varied background. In general, the
problems Coates has encountered are
relatively easy microscopically, but have
required significant thought prior to instrument
time. The techniques that will be described are
an accumulation of methods gleaned over a

period of several years. Because the microscope is a convenient and efficient tool, it is usually the instrument of choice for microchemical analyses.

The lecture is free and open to the public. Attendees should enter the Museum at the entrance on 77<sup>th</sup> street (between Central Park West and Columbus Ave).

microscopic eight-legged aquatic animals that can survive for years in a state of suspended animation.

To access the MMH's main building for any reason, including to attend the Water Bear Hunt in the Parlor, NYMS members (other than 8 of us who will run the workshop) must pay for lunch. Members who reserve in advance \*as a group\* to eat together at MMH can pay the group rate of \$49.50 per adult and \$25 per child ages 4 to 12. Children under 4 eat for free. Only groups have the option to pay in the dining room instead of when reserving. One bill is preferred, but if our group is fewer than 15 people she'll allow us to pay individually. Members who wish to lunch apart from the NYMS group must do like any regular guest: phone to reserve a lunch table, and pay in advance the regular lunch price of \$58.25/adult, \$31.50/child.

Note: all Mohonk's lunch prices include taxes, gratuity, access to MMH's public rooms, parking near the main building, and the day-fee to access MMH's extensive grounds.

Members who want to access the MMH grounds only enter also at the MMH's Gate House. They park there (2.2 miles from MMH) and pay MMH's midweek Day Hiking Fee of \$17/adult, \$12/child. Access to MMH's main building is not included, however people with day passes can use the Picnic Lodge, which has restrooms and sells soft drinks and snack foods. It is not closeby MMH.

Members who prefer the most economical way to visit this area can choose to enter the separately owned and run Mohonk Preserve, whose center (with restrooms, etc.) is about 5 miles from the MMH Gate House. Mohonk Preserve's Day Fee is \$9/adult. The Preserve's huge acreage includes 4 Hiking Trail Heads, none near MMH. The Preserve has reciprocity with the Mountain House, so it's possible, but not convenient, for Mohonk Preserve hikers, carrying Mohonk Preserve day passes or membership cards, to enter the MMH grounds (only), including the Picnic Lodge.








Single page from a Mort Abramowitz microphotograph of a Micro-Fiche of the entire Holy Bible. Magnified 300x
